## Analysis

---

**And they two made a covenant before the LORD: and David abode in the wood, and Jonathan went to his house.**

This covenant renewal deepens their bond at a critical moment. The Hebrew 'vayikhetru sheinehem berit' (they two cut a covenant) employs the traditional covenant-making language. The phrase 'before the LORD' (liphnei Yahweh) invokes divine witness and guarantee. After this sacred moment, their paths diverge—David to continued hiding, Jonathan to his father's house. They would never meet again; Jonathan would die with Saul at Gilboa. This final covenant stands as the capstone of their friendship, a solemn commitment maintained until death. The scene models how covenant relationships sustain through separation and uncertainty.

## Historical Context

---

This was the third recorded covenant between David and Jonathan (18:3; 20:16-17, 42). Each renewal came at a critical juncture. The wilderness setting made this covenant particularly poignant, ratified amid danger rather than celebration.
