

# Acts 19:2

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

He said unto them, Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost.

## Analysis

---

Paul's question - 'Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed?' - revealed these Ephesian disciples' incomplete understanding. Their response 'We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost' indicated they were disciples of John rather than fully Christian believers. This encounter shows the transition from John's preparatory ministry to Christian fullness.

## Historical Context

---

These disciples, like Apollos, apparently received teaching about Jesus through John the Baptist's followers without learning about Pentecost and Spirit baptism. Paul's instruction brought them to full Christian understanding and experience.

## Additional Cross-References

---

**1 Corinthians 6:19** (Holy): What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own?

**John 7:39** (Faith): (But this spake he of the Spirit, which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified.)

**Acts 19:5** (Parallel theme): When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

**Galatians 3:5** (Faith): He therefore that ministereth to you the Spirit, and worketh miracles among you, doeth he it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?
