And the same man had four daughters, virgins, which did prophesy.

Analysis

The mention of Philip's 'four daughters which did prophesy' highlights the Spirit's distribution of gifts regardless of gender. The Greek 'propheteuō' indicates they regularly exercised prophetic gifting, though within the ordered structure Paul elsewhere describes. This demonstrates the early church's recognition of women's Spirit-empowered ministry within appropriate boundaries.

Historical Context

Prophetic gifting among women was predicted by Joel (Joel 2:28-29) and affirmed at Pentecost. These daughters likely ministered within the Caesarean church community, continuing the Old Testament tradition of prophetesses like Deborah and Huldah.

Acts 2:17 (Prophecy): And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams:
