Then there arose certain of the synagogue, which is called the synagogue of the Libertines, and Cyrenians, and Alexandrians, and of them of Cilicia and of Asia, disputing with Stephen.

Analysis

Opposition arose from 'the synagogue of the Libertines' (freedmen, possibly former slaves) and various Diaspora groups. 'Disputing with Stephen' indicates attempted debate. When argument failed, they resorted to false accusation. Intellectual defeat often produces violent reaction.

Historical Context

Multiple Hellenistic synagogues in Jerusalem served diaspora Jews. Stephen's apologetic skill made him a target. These were Jews from Cyrene, Alexandria, Cilicia, and Asia Minor.

Additional Cross-References

Acts 15:41 (Parallel theme): And he went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches.

Acts 23:34 (Parallel theme): And when the governor had read the letter, he asked of what province he was. And when he understood that he was of Cilicia;

Acts 22:3 (Parallel theme): I am verily a man which am a Jew, born in Tarsus, a city in Cilicia, yet brought up in this city at the feet of Gamaliel, and taught according to the perfect manner of the law of the fathers, and was zealous toward God, as ye all are this day.

Acts 15:23 (Parallel theme): And they wrote letters by them after this manner; The apostles and elders and brethren send greeting unto the brethren which are of the Gentiles in Antioch and Syria and Cilicia:

Matthew 27:32 (Parallel theme): And as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name: him they compelled to bear his cross.

Acts 21:27 (Parallel theme): And when the seven days were almost ended, the Jews which were of Asia, when they saw him in the temple, stirred up all the people, and laid hands on him,

Acts 18:24 (Parallel theme): And a certain Jew named Apollos, born at Alexandria, an eloquent man, and mighty in the scriptures, came to Ephesus.

Mark 13:9 (Parallel theme): But take heed to yourselves: for they shall deliver you up to councils; and in the synagogues ye shall be beaten: and ye shall be brought before rulers and kings for my sake, for a testimony against them.
