But I will kindle a fire in the wall of Rabbah, and it shall devour the palaces thereof, with shouting in the day of battle, with a tempest in the day of the whirlwind:

Analysis

I will kindle a fire in the wall of Rabbah (אֶצִּית אֵשׁ בְּחוֹמַת רַבָּה, *atsit esh b'chomat rabbah*)—God's judgment comes as consuming fire against Ammon's capital. The Hebrew אֶצִּית (*atsit*, 'I will kindle') emphasizes divine agency; this is not merely human warfare but Yahweh's direct intervention. **With shouting in the day of battle, with a tempest in the day of the whirlwind** combines military siege (תְּרוּעָה, *teruah*, the war cry) with natural disaster imagery—God orchestrates both human armies and cosmic forces for judgment.

Rabbah (modern Amman, Jordan) represented Ammonite pride and military power. The 'palaces' (אַרְמֻנוֹתֶיהָ, *armenoteha*) symbolize accumulated wealth gained through oppression. This prophecy was fulfilled when Nebuchadnezzar conquered Ammon in 582 BC, though Christ ultimately judges all nations at His return (Matthew 25:31-46).

Historical Context

Amos prophesied around 760-750 BC during Jeroboam II's reign. Ammon, descended from Lot (Genesis 19:38), had longstanding enmity with Israel. They committed atrocities against Gilead (Amos 1:13), including ripping open pregnant women to expand territory—crimes that demanded divine retribution.

1. How does God's sovereignty over nations challenge modern nationalism and the belief that any country is beyond judgment?
2. What 'palaces' of accumulated wealth in your life might represent injustice or oppression of others?

Additional Cross-References

Jeremiah 49:2 (Parallel theme): Therefore, behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will cause an alarm of war to be heard in Rabbah of the Ammonites; and it shall be a desolate heap, and her daughters shall be burned with fire: then shall Israel be heir unto them that were his heirs, saith the LORD.

Deuteronomy 3:11 (Parallel theme): For only Og king of Bashan remained of the remnant of giants; behold, his bedstead was a bedstead of iron; is it not in Rabbath of the children of Ammon? nine cubits was the length thereof, and four cubits the breadth of it, after the cubit of a man.
