And when we departed from Horeb, we went through all that great and terrible wilderness, which ye saw by the way of the mountain of the Amorites, as the LORD our God commanded us; and we came to Kadesh-barnea.

Analysis

The comprehensive scope—'between every man and his brother, and the stranger that is with him'—extends justice beyond blood relations to include foreigners residing among Israel. This reflects God's concern for the vulnerable and marginalized, as strangers lacked family protection and tribal advocacy. True righteousness transcends ethnic and social boundaries, treating all image-bearers with equal dignity under God's law.

Historical Context

The inclusion of strangers ('ger') in legal protections was revolutionary in ancient Near Eastern law codes. This principle flows from Israel's own experience as strangers in Egypt and God's command to remember and care for the vulnerable (Exodus 22:21; 23:9).

Additional Cross-References

Deuteronomy 1:2 (Parallel theme): (There are eleven days' journey from Horeb by the way of mount Seir unto Kadesh-barnea.)

Jeremiah 2:6 (References Lord): Neither said they, Where is the LORD that brought us up out of the land of Egypt, that led us through the wilderness, through a land of deserts and of pits, through a land of drought, and of the shadow of death, through a land that no man passed through, and where no man dwelt?

Deuteronomy 8:15 (Parallel theme): Who led thee through that great and terrible wilderness, wherein were fiery serpents, and scorpions, and drought, where there was no water; who brought thee forth water out of the rock of flint;
