Analysis

But of the cities of these people, which the LORD thy God doth give thee for an inheritance, thou shalt save alive nothing that breatheth—The Canaanite herem demanded total destruction: **nothing that breatheth** (כל-נשמה, kol-neshamah, literally 'every breath'). This wasn't ethnic cleansing but spiritual surgery—removing cancer threatening Israel's covenant relationship. God's explicit command (next verse) makes His purpose clear: prevent idolatry contagion.

Israel's incomplete obedience (failing to execute full herem) caused centuries of apostasy. **They did not destroy the nations, concerning whom the LORD commanded them: But were mingled among the heathen, and learned their works...Therefore was the wrath of the LORD kindled against his people** (Psalm 106:34-35, 40). Spiritual compromise never stays contained; it metastasizes. Jesus demands similar ruthlessness with personal sin: **If thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out** (Matthew 5:29)—radical amputation prevents spiritual death.

Historical Context

The seven Canaanite nations (Hittites, Gergashites, Amorites, Canaanites, Perizzites, Hivites, Jebusites) occupied the Promised Land. Archaeological evidence confirms widespread child sacrifice, ritual prostitution, and brutality.

God's 400-year patience (Genesis 15:16) expired; judgment came through Israel's conquest.

Additional Cross-References

Joshua 11:14 (Parallel theme): And all the spoil of these cities, and the cattle, the children of Israel took for a prey unto themselves; but every man they smote with the edge of the sword, until they had destroyed them, neither left they any to breathe.

Numbers 33:52 (Parallel theme): Then ye shall drive out all the inhabitants of the land from before you, and destroy all their pictures, and destroy all their molten images, and quite pluck down all their high places:
