The Vanity of Labor and Isolation

- ¹ So I returned, and considered all the oppressions that are done under the sun: and behold the tears of such as were oppressed, and they had no comforter; and on the side of their oppressors there was power; but they had no comforter.
- ² Wherefore I praised the dead which are already dead more than the living which are yet alive.
- ³ Yea, better is he than both they, which hath not yet been, who hath not seen the evil work that is done under the sun.
- ⁴ Again, I considered all travail, and every right work, that for this a man is envied of his neighbour. This is also vanity and vexation of spirit.
- ⁵ The fool foldeth his hands together, and eateth his own flesh.
- ⁶ Better is an handful with quietness, than both the hands full with travail and vexation of spirit.
- 7 Then I returned, and I saw vanity under the sun.
- ⁸ There is one alone, and there is not a second; yea, he hath neither child nor brother: yet is there no end of all his labour; neither is his eye satisfied with riches; neither saith he, For whom do I labour, and bereave my soul of good? This is also vanity, yea, it is a sore travail.
- $^{9}\,$ Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.
- ¹⁰ For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up.

Ecclesiastes 4

 11 Again, if two lie together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone?

¹² And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

¹³ Better is a poor and a wise child than an old and foolish king, who will no more be admonished.

 14 For out of prison he cometh to reign; whereas also he that is born in his kingdom

becometh poor.

¹⁵ I considered all the living which walk under the sun, with the second child that

shall stand up in his stead.

¹⁶ There is no end of all the people, even of all that have been before them: they also

that come after shall not rejoice in him. Surely this also is vanity and vexation of

spirit.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Kingdom — מַלכוּת (Malkhut)

Kingdom, reign, royal power

The Hebrew **malkhut** (מַלְכוּת) denotes kingdom or royal rule—the realm and reign of a king. God's kingdom represents His sovereign rule over all creation.

Spirit — רוּחַ (Ruach)

Spirit, wind, breath

The Hebrew **ruach** (רוֹחַ) means spirit, wind, or breath—invisible but powerful. It describes both the Holy Spirit and the human spirit. God's Spirit gives life and empowers His people.
