Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

Analysis

[Verse 1:14 text would be quoted here] This verse in Ephesians chapter 1 addresses theological theme. Key Greek terms include to be determined.

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

Historical Context

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 1 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

Additional Cross-References

2 Corinthians 5:5 (Parallel theme): Now he that hath wrought us for the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit.

2 Corinthians 1:22 (Parallel theme): Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.

Ephesians 4:30 (Redemption): And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

Galatians 4:6 (Parallel theme): And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father.

Ephesians 1:12 (Glory): That we should be to the praise of his glory, who first trusted in Christ.

Psalms 74:2 (Redemption): Remember thy congregation, which thou hast purchased of old; the rod of thine inheritance, which thou hast redeemed; this mount Zion, wherein thou hast dwelt.

Psalms 78:54 (Parallel theme): And he brought them to the border of his sanctuary, even to this mountain, which his right hand had purchased.
