That the Gentiles should be fellowheirs, and of the same body, and partakers of his promise in Christ by the gospel:

Analysis

[Verse 3:6 text would be quoted here] This verse in Ephesians chapter 3 addresses theological theme. Key Greek terms include to be determined.

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

Historical Context

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 3 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

Additional Cross-References

1 John 2:25 (Covenant): And this is the promise that he hath promised us, even eternal life.

1 John 1:3 (References Christ): That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ.

Galatians 3:14 (Covenant): That the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.

Colossians 2:19 (Parallel theme): And not holding the Head, from which all the body by joints and bands having nourishment ministered, and knit together, increaseth with the increase of God.

1 Corinthians 12:27 (References Christ): Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular.

Ephesians 5:30 (Parallel theme): For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones.

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
