

# Ephesians 5:14

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Wherefore he saith, Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light.

## Analysis

---

**[Verse 5:14 text would be quoted here]** This verse in Ephesians chapter 5 addresses theological theme. Key Greek terms include to be determined.

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

## Historical Context

---

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 5 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

**Isaiah 60:1** (Resurrection): Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee.

**Isaiah 26:19** (Resurrection): Thy dead men shall live, together with my dead body shall they arise. Awake and sing, ye that dwell in dust: for thy dew is as the dew of herbs, and the earth shall cast out the dead.

**1 Thessalonians 5:6** (Parallel theme): Therefore let us not sleep, as do others; but let us watch and be sober.

**Isaiah 52:1** (Parallel theme): Awake, awake; put on thy strength, O Zion; put on thy beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city: for henceforth there shall no more come into thee the uncircumcised and the unclean.

**Colossians 3:1** (Resurrection): If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God.

**Romans 6:13** (Parallel theme): Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God.

**John 9:5** (Light): As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.

**John 8:12** (Light): Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.
