Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

## Analysis

---

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

## Historical Context

---

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 5 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

## Additional Cross-References

**Colossians 4:5** (Redemption): Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time.

**Amos 5:13** (Evil): Therefore the prudent shall keep silence in that time; for it is an evil time.

**John 12:35** (Parallel theme): Then Jesus said unto them, Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you: for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth.

**Ephesians 6:13** (Evil): Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

**Romans 13:11** (Parallel theme): And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed.

**Ecclesiastes 9:10** (Parallel theme): Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.

**1 Corinthians 7:26** (Parallel theme): I suppose therefore that this is good for the present distress, I say, that it is good for a man so to be.

**Psalms 37:19** (Evil): They shall not be ashamed in the evil time: and in the days of famine they shall be satisfied.
