Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God.

Analysis

[Verse 5:21 text would be quoted here] This verse in Ephesians chapter 5 addresses theological theme. Key Greek terms include to be determined.

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

Historical Context

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 5 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

Additional Cross-References

Philippians 2:3 (Parallel theme): Let nothing be done through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves.

Ephesians 5:24 (Parallel theme): Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in every thing.

Ephesians 5:22 (Parallel theme): Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord.

1 Peter 5:5 (References God): Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, all of you be subject one to another, and be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble.

Hebrews 13:17 (Parallel theme): Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you.

1 Timothy 3:4 (Parallel theme): One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity;

1 Peter 2:17 (References God): Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king.

Galatians 5:13 (Parallel theme): For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

1 Timothy 2:11 (Parallel theme): Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection.

1 Corinthians 16:16 (Parallel theme): That ye submit yourselves unto such, and to every one that helpeth with us, and laboureth.
