Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doeth, the same shall he receive of the Lord, whether he be bond or free.

Analysis

[Verse 6:8 text would be quoted here] This verse in Ephesians chapter 6 addresses theological theme. Key Greek terms include to be determined.

The theological focus is doctrinal emphasis, demonstrating Paul's emphasis on the cosmic Christ and the church as His body/bride/temple. The phrase emphasizes union with Christ as the foundation of all spiritual blessings.

Historical Context

Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment (60-62 CE), this verse in chapter 6 reflects the circular letter's purpose to multiple Asian churches. Ephesus was a major center of pagan worship (Artemis cult) and early Christianity, making Paul's teachings on spiritual warfare and Christian unity particularly relevant.

Additional Cross-References

Colossians 3:24 (References Lord): Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.

Luke 14:14 (Parallel theme): And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.

Colossians 3:11 (Parallel theme): Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond nor free: but Christ is all, and in all.

Proverbs 23:18 (Parallel theme): For surely there is an end; and thine expectation shall not be cut off.

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
