

# Exodus 12:36

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And the LORD gave the people favour in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they lent unto them such things as they required. And they spoiled the Egyptians.

## Analysis

---

The LORD giving Israel 'favour in the sight of the Egyptians' fulfills His promise (Exodus 3:21, 11:3). The verb 'lent' (sha'al, שָׁאַל) means 'gave' or 'granted'—Egyptians gave freely, knowing Israel would not return. The phrase 'they spoiled the Egyptians' (vayinatzlu, וַיִּנָּצְלוּ—plundered/stripped) uses covenant-lawsuit language: Israel received legal compensation for injustice. Egypt's wealth transfers to God's people.

## Historical Context

---

This transfer of wealth fulfilled God's promise to Abraham that his descendants would 'come out with great substance' (Genesis 15:14). The gold and silver later became tabernacle materials.

## Additional Cross-References

**Acts 7:10** (References Egypt): And delivered him out of all his afflictions, and gave him favour and wisdom in the sight of Pharaoh king of Egypt; and he made him governor over Egypt and all his house.
