

# Exodus 12:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats:

## Analysis

---

The lamb must be 'tamiym' (תָּמִימָה)—without blemish, perfect, complete. This requirement establishes the principle of substitutionary perfection: the sacrifice must be flawless to bear the penalty for the flawed. Peter explicitly connects this to Christ: 'a lamb without blemish and without spot' (1 Peter 1:19). The 'male of the first year' indicates prime vitality.

## Historical Context

---

Ancient Near Eastern sacrificial systems required unblemished animals, but Israel's Passover lamb uniquely combined domestic intimacy (selected four days early) with sacrificial perfection.

## Additional Cross-References

---

**Malachi 1:14** (Parallel theme): But cursed be the deceiver, which hath in his flock a male, and voweth, and sacrificeth unto the Lord a corrupt thing: for I am a great King, saith the LORD of hosts, and my name is dreadful among the heathen.

**Deuteronomy 17:1** (Parallel theme): Thou shalt not sacrifice unto the LORD thy God any bullock, or sheep, wherein is blemish, or any evilfavouredness: for that is an abomination unto the LORD thy God.

**Hebrews 7:26** (Parallel theme): For such an high priest became us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens;

**Leviticus 1:10** (Parallel theme): And if his offering be of the flocks, namely, of the sheep, or of the goats, for a burnt sacrifice; he shall bring it a male without blemish.

**Leviticus 23:12** (Parallel theme): And ye shall offer that day when ye wave the sheaf an he lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering unto the LORD.

**Leviticus 1:3** (Parallel theme): If his offering be a burnt sacrifice of the herd, let him offer a male without blemish: he shall offer it of his own voluntary will at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation before the LORD.
