

Exodus 14:30

Thus the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the sea shore.

Analysis

The summary statement 'the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians' credits God alone for deliverance. The verb 'saved' (yasha, יָשָׁא) is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua)—God saves. The phrase 'Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the sea shore' provided visible confirmation of complete victory. Seeing enemy corpses washed ashore proved the threat was ended. What terrified them the day before now lies lifeless—God's thorough salvation.

Historical Context

Bodies and equipment washing ashore after the storm provided tangible proof of Egypt's destruction. This visual confirmation assured Israel the threat was permanently ended, not merely delayed.

Additional Cross-References
