

# Exodus 17:4

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do unto this people? they be almost ready to stone me.

## Analysis

---

**And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, What shall I do unto this people? they be almost ready to stone me**—Moses' cry demonstrates proper response: taking complaint to God rather than arguing with complainers. His question 'What shall I do?' recognizes human insufficiency—Moses cannot create water. The phrase 'almost ready to stone me' (עַד מְאֹד מְאֵלֵּלִי, *od m'at us'qaluni*) reveals how quickly murmuring becomes murder in intent. This prefigures Christ's crucifixion: like Moses, the appointed deliverer faces death from those He came to save. Moses' intercession despite their hostility models Christ's prayer: 'Father, forgive them' (Luke 23:34). Leadership means bearing others' unbelief while seeking God's solution.

## Historical Context

---

Stoning was community execution for extreme offenses. Israel's willingness to execute Moses shows the depth of their unbelief and the danger leaders face when following God through trials.

## Additional Cross-References

**1 Samuel 30:6** (References Lord): And David was greatly distressed; for the people spake of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and for his daughters: but David encouraged himself in the LORD his God.
