Analysis

And he said, Who made thee a prince and a judge over us? intendest thou to kill me, as thou killedst the Egyptian? And Moses feared, and said, Surely this thing is known (וַיֹּאמֶר מֹשֶׁה מַن־הָיָה תְּחִזְקֵנִי לְאִישׁ־שָׁרֵךְ וְשָׁפֵט עַל־עַמִּינוּ) —The Hebrew's challenge cuts deep: **Who made thee a prince and a judge?** Moses has no delegated authority, only self-appointed intervention. Stephen later cites this rejection (Acts 7:27-28, 35), showing Israel's pattern of rejecting God's deliverers until He validates them. **Intendest thou to kill me, as thou killedst the Egyptian?** —the secret is out. **Moses feared** (וַיַּירַא) —now Moses fears man rather than acting courageously. **Surely this thing is known** —discovery brings consequences (v. 15).

Historical Context

The question "Who made thee a prince and judge?" anticipates Moses' later divine commission (3:10-12). What Moses attempted through human zeal, God would accomplish through supernatural calling. The 40-year gap between this rejection and Moses' return (Acts 7:30) represents God's patient preparation of His chosen deliverer.
