Analysis

And my wrath shall wax hot, and I will kill you with the sword; and your wives shall be widows, and your children fatherless.

God's special concern for society's vulnerable appears throughout Scripture. The poor (אֶּבְיוֹן, evyon), widows (אֵלְמָנָה, almanah), and strangers (אֶבְיוֹן, ger) lacked powerful advocates—so God becomes their defender. These laws protect against economic exploitation, demanding compassion rather than merely permitting it. Israel's own Egyptian oppression should create empathy for the marginalized. James defines pure religion as caring for widows and orphans (James 1:27); the early church prioritized these groups.

Historical Context

Widows, orphans, and foreigners in ancient societies often faced destitution without male protection. Israel's laws mandated care for these groups, making compassion a covenant obligation rather than optional charity.
