

# Exodus 24:1

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And he said unto Moses, Come up unto the LORD, thou, and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel; and worship ye afar off.

## Analysis

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**And he said unto Moses, Come up unto the LORD, thou, and Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel; and worship ye afar off.**

Covenant ratification begins with graded access: Moses, Aaron and sons (Nadab, Abihu), seventy elders—but all worship 'afar off' (מֵרַחֵק, merachok). Only Moses will approach closer (v. 2). The seventy elders represent the nation in covenant witnessing. Nadab and Abihu's later rebellion (Leviticus 10) shows proximity to God doesn't guarantee godliness. The elders see God's glory (v. 10) yet maintain distance—awe and access coexist. The New Covenant removes distance—we approach the throne of grace with confidence (Hebrews 4:16), but reverence remains.

## Historical Context

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The seventy elders (likely tribal and family heads) represent Israel in covenant ratification. Their witnessing role legally validates the covenant. Nadab and Abihu were Aaron's oldest sons, presumptive heirs to high priesthood.

## Additional Cross-References

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**Numbers 11:16** (References Lord): And the LORD said unto Moses, Gather unto me seventy men of the elders of Israel, whom thou knowest to be the elders of the people, and officers over them; and bring them unto the tabernacle of the congregation, that they may stand there with thee.
