Authorized King James Version (KJV)

The length of one curtain shall be eight and twenty cubits, and the breadth of one curtain four cubits: and every one of the curtains shall have one measure.

Analysis

Precise measurements: each curtain 28 cubits \times 4 cubits. Nothing in God's dwelling is haphazard. These dimensions (approximately 42' \times 6') ensured perfect fit when joined together. The uniformity teaches that all elements of worship must harmonize according to divine design. Just as these curtains formed one unified covering, the church—Christ's dwelling—comprises diverse members unified in Him (Ephesians 2:21-22).

Historical Context

A cubit was approximately 18 inches (length from elbow to fingertip). The specific dimensions enabled the ten curtains to be coupled into two sets of five, creating the tabernacle's roof structure with precise coverage.
