in the mount, so shall they make it.

**Analysis** 

The altar is made 'hollow with boards'—not solid but a frame, likely filled with earth or stones at each camp (Exodus 20:24-25). This hollow construction made it portable yet functional. The principle: the altar's form matters (God's prescribed pattern) but its core is filled with created materials (earth/stones). Christ's humanity (earth) filled divine form, making atonement both heavenly in origin and

earthly in execution. God's pattern received material substance.

**Historical Context** 

The hollow construction reduced weight for transport while the copper-plate covering provided the sacrificial surface. At each camping site, the altar would be filled with earth, creating a functional sacrificial platform that could be emptied

and moved when needed.
