Analysis

And I will stretch out my hand, and smite Egypt with all my wonders which I will do in the midst thereof: and after that he will let you go (וְשַׁלַּחְתִּי אֶת־יָדִי וְנִפְלְאֹתַי אֲשֶׁר אֶעֱשֶׂה בְּקִרְבּוֹ וְאַחֲרָיֶן יִשְׁלַח אֶתְכֶם) —God's strategy: overwhelming demonstrations of power. **Stretch out my hand** (וְשַׁלַּחְתִּי אֶת־יָדִי)—anthropomorphic language for divine intervention. **Smite Egypt with all my wonders** (וְנִפְלְאֹתַי ... בְּקִרְבּוֹ)—**wonders** (נִפְלְאוֹת, nifla'ot) are the ten plagues, miraculous demonstrations of YHWH's supremacy over Egyptian gods. **In the midst thereof** (בְּקִרְבּוֹ)—the plagues will occur in Egypt's heartland, not peripheral regions. **After that he will let you go**—eventually Pharaoh surrenders, though reluctantly and temporarily (14:5-9). The plagues serve multiple purposes: judgment on Egypt, deliverance for Israel, revelation of YHWH's character.

Historical Context

The ten plagues systematically demonstrated YHWH's supremacy over Egypt's pantheon: Nile (Hapi), frogs (Heqet), sun (Ra), Pharaoh himself (considered divine). Each plague targeted specific Egyptian deities, showing their impotence. The escalation—from nuisance to economic devastation to death—gave Pharaoh repeated opportunities to relent. His hardening after each plague (Exodus 7-11) fulfilled this prophecy exactly.

Additional Cross-References

Acts 7:36 (References Egypt): He brought them out, after that he had shewed wonders and signs in the land of Egypt, and in the Red sea, and in the wilderness forty years.
