

# Exodus 3:22

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

But every woman shall borrow of her neighbour, and of her that sojourneth in her house, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment: and ye shall put them upon your sons, and upon your daughters; and ye shall spoil the Egyptians.

## Analysis

**But every woman shall borrow of her neighbour, and of her that sojourneth in her house, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment: and ye shall put them upon your sons, and upon your daughters; and ye shall spoil the Egyptians** (וְשָׂאֵלָה אִשָּׁה מִשְׁכֻּנְתָּהּ וּמִגֵּבַת בֵּיתָהּ כָּל־יָכֶסֶף וְכָל־יָזָב וּשְׂמֵלֶת... וְנִצְלְתֶּם אֶת־מִצְרַיִם)—The method: **borrow** (שָׂאֵל, sha'al, more accurately "ask/request") items from neighbors. **Jewels of silver and gold, and raiment**—valuable portable wealth. **Put them upon your sons and daughters**—adorning the next generation. **Ye shall spoil the Egyptians** (וְנִצְלְתֶּם אֶת־מִצְרַיִם, venitsaltem et-Mitsrayim)—**spoil** (נִצַּל, natsal) means "plunder/strip." This is poetic justice: Egypt exploited Israel's labor for centuries; now Israel takes Egypt's wealth. The fulfillment (12:35-36) shows Egyptians giving willingly, eager for Israel to leave. God orchestrates recompense and provides resources for wilderness journey and tabernacle worship.

## Historical Context

The 'borrowing' language (KJV) misled some to think Israel acted deceptively. Better translation: 'ask/request.' Exodus 12:35-36 shows Egyptians gave willingly—after the tenth plague, they were desperate for Israel to leave and gave generously (12:33). This wealth transfer reversed economic exploitation and fulfilled God's

promise of leaving 'with great substance' (Genesis 15:14). The silver and gold later funded tabernacle construction (Exodus 25-40).

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1. How does the 'spoiling of Egypt' illustrate God's justice in compensating the oppressed and judging oppressors economically as well as physically?

## Additional Cross-References

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**Ezekiel 39:10** (Parallel theme): So that they shall take no wood out of the field, neither cut down any out of the forests; for they shall burn the weapons with fire: and they shall spoil those that spoiled them, and rob those that robbed them, saith the Lord GOD.

**Psalms 105:37** (Parallel theme): He brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes.

**Exodus 11:2** (Parallel theme): Speak now in the ears of the people, and let every man borrow of his neighbour, and every woman of her neighbour, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold.

**Isaiah 33:1** (Parallel theme): Woe to thee that spoilest, and thou wast not spoiled; and dealest treacherously, and they dealt not treacherously with thee! when thou shalt cease to spoil, thou shalt be spoiled; and when thou shalt make an end to deal treacherously, they shall deal treacherously with thee.
