And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee; and will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will shew mercy.

Analysis

And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee—God grants Moses' request but on divine terms. Rather than abstract glory, God reveals His טוב (tuv, 'goodness')—His moral excellence and benevolent character. The proclamation of Yahweh's name reveals His covenant faithfulness. The phrase 'I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will shew mercy' asserts divine sovereignty in dispensing grace (quoted in Romans 9:15). Grace cannot be earned or demanded; it flows from God's free will. This revelation becomes foundational for understanding God's character throughout Scripture.

Historical Context

This proclamation anticipates Exodus 34:6-7, where God passes by Moses declaring His name and attributes. Paul quotes this verse in Romans 9:15 to defend God's sovereign election, showing its theological importance beyond the immediate context.

Additional Cross-References

Jeremiah 31:14 (Good): And I will satiate the soul of the priests with fatness, and my people shall be satisfied with my goodness, saith the LORD.

Jeremiah 31:12 (Good): Therefore they shall come and sing in the height of Zion, and shall flow together to the goodness of the LORD, for wheat, and for wine, and for oil, and for the young of the flock and of the herd: and their soul shall be as a watered garden; and they shall not sorrow any more at all.
