

Exodus 34:7

Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and to the fourth generation.

Analysis

God extends mercy to thousands (אלפים, alaphim) but visits iniquity to three or four generations—mercy outweighs judgment 250:1. Yet God 'will by no means clear the guilty' (נָקֵה לֹא יִנָּקֵה, naqeh lo yenaqeh)—an emphatic Hebrew construction meaning judgment is certain. This tension between mercy and justice finds resolution only at Calvary, where God's righteousness and love meet (Ps 85:10). The three terms—אָוֶן (avon, iniquity), פֶּשַׁע (pesha, transgression), חַטָּאת (chatta'ah, sin)—cover all categories of rebellion.

Historical Context

The concept of corporate/generational responsibility was fundamental to ancient covenant society. Children often suffered consequences of parents' sins, yet each generation remained accountable (Ezek 18).
