And he made boards for the tabernacle of shittim wood, standing up.

Analysis

The boards (קֶשֶׁת, kerashim) of shittim wood (acacia) overlaid with gold form the tabernacle's structural frame—humanity (wood) clothed in divinity (gold). Standing upright (עַמְדִים, omedim), these boards represent believers standing firm in God's house, rooted in divine strength. The dual nature (wood and gold) prefigures Christ's two natures (human and divine) and believers' identity (earthly origin, heavenly standing)—'you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God' (Colossians 3:3).

Historical Context

Each board was approximately 15 feet tall by 2.25 feet wide (10 cubits × 1.5 cubits), made from acacia wood completely overlaid with gold. These boards, fitted into silver sockets, formed three sides of the rectangular tabernacle structure (back and two sides), with curtains forming the entrance.

1. How do the boards (wood overlaid with gold) standing upright illustrate believers' identity in Christ?
2. What does the transformation of desert-grown acacia into gold-covered boards teach about redemption and sanctification?
