And they made the plate of the holy crown of pure gold, and wrote upon it a writing, like to the engravings of a signet, **HOLINESS TO THE LORD.**

Analysis

The golden plate (צִיץ, tsits, flower/shining thing) engraved 'HOLINESS TO THE LORD' (קדש ליהה, qodesh l'YHWH) represents the pinnacle of priestly ministry—consecration. Worn on Aaron's forehead (v. 31), this declaration faced both God (when entering the Holy Place) and people (when blessing them). The inscription teaches that acceptable ministry requires holiness, not mere ritual. The golden material signifies divine glory; engraving indicates permanence. This holy crown prefigures Christ, perfectly holy (Hebrews 7:26), whose consecration enables ours (Hebrews 10:10, 14).

Historical Context

The golden plate's frontal position made the inscription visible to all, proclaiming that Israel's high priest represented holiness before God and to the nation. The 'signet' engraving style ensured permanence—this was no temporary decoration but permanent declaration.

1. How does 'HOLINESS TO THE LORD' on the forehead teach that ministry's essence is consecration, not activity?
2. What does Christ's perfect holiness accomplishing believers' consecration reveal about grace?
