

Ezekiel 23:49

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And they shall recompense your lewdness upon you, and ye shall bear the sins of your idols: and ye shall know that I am the Lord GOD.

Analysis

The covenant formula 'ye shall know that I am the Lord GOD' reveals judgment's pedagogical purpose. God's ultimate goal is that His people recognize His sovereignty, holiness, and covenant faithfulness. Even judgment serves this redemptive purpose. 'Bear the sins of your idols' means experiencing full consequences without blaming God, acknowledging that rebellion brings ruin.

Historical Context

The 586 BC destruction of Jerusalem and 70-year exile taught Israel to loathe idolatry. Post-exilic Judaism never again succumbed to idolatry, demonstrating that God's discipline accomplished its corrective purpose.

Additional Cross-References

Ezekiel 7:4 (References Lord): And mine eye shall not spare thee, neither will I have pity: but I will recompense thy ways upon thee, and thine abominations shall be in the midst of thee: and ye shall know that I am the LORD.

Ezekiel 9:10 (Parallel theme): And as for me also, mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity, but I will recompense their way upon their head.

Isaiah 59:18 (Parallel theme): According to their deeds, accordingly he will repay, fury to his adversaries, recompence to his enemies; to the islands he will repay recompence.
