

Ezekiel 25:10

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Unto the men of the east with the Ammonites, and will give them in possession, that the Ammonites may not be remembered among the nations.

Analysis

Moab would share Ammon's fate—conquest by 'men of the east' and loss of national identity 'that Ammon be no more remembered.' Complete erasure from history represents ultimate judgment. This reveals that opposing God's redemptive purposes leads to futility and oblivion, while serving God's kingdom brings eternal significance.

Historical Context

By the Hellenistic period, Moab had ceased to exist as a distinct nation. Their territory was absorbed by Nabatean Arabs, then later Roman provinces. Today, no ethnic Moabites exist, fulfilling the prophecy of complete disappearance.
