And I will make Pathros desolate, and will set fire in Zoan, and will execute judgments in No.

Analysis

And I will make Pathros desolate, and will set fire in Zoan, and will execute judgments in No—Three Egyptian regions: פְּתָרוֹס (Patrôś, Upper Egypt/southern region), צֶעַן (Ṣō'an, Zoan/Tanis in the Delta), and נֹ (Nō', No/Thebes, the great southern capital). God's judgment spans all Egypt, north to south.

נָתַתִּי אֵשׁ (nātattî 'ēsh, 'set fire') indicates complete destruction. Thebes (No-Amon) was Egypt's religious heart, home to the Karnak temple complex. Its destruction demonstrated YHWH's superiority over Amun-Ra, Egypt's chief deity. Nahum 3:8-10 describes Thebes' earlier fall to Assyria (663 BC) as a warning to Nineveh; here, its destruction by Babylon continues Egypt's humiliation. No Egyptian region would escape God's judgment.

Historical Context

Archaeological and historical records confirm widespread destruction in Egypt during Babylon's invasion. Thebes, though previously sacked by Assyria (663 BC), suffered further in this period and never regained preeminence. Zoan (biblical Rameses) declined. The comprehensive geographical scope of Ezekiel's oracle—from southern Pathros to northern Zoan—matched the comprehensive nature of Babylon's campaign.

Additional Cross-References

Jeremiah 46:25 (Parallel theme): The LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, saith; Behold, I will punish the multitude of No, and Pharaoh, and Egypt, with their gods, and their kings; even Pharaoh, and all them that trust in him:
