

# Ezekiel 30:4

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And the sword shall come upon Egypt, and great pain shall be in Ethiopia, when the slain shall fall in Egypt, and they shall take away her multitude, and her foundations shall be broken down.

## Analysis

---

The 'sword' represents military conquest, specifically Babylon's invasion. Egypt's 'pain' and Ethiopia's 'great pain' indicate widespread suffering. The phrase 'they shall take away her multitude' depicts deportation and plundering. God's judgments often come through secondary causes (pagan armies) while remaining sovereignly directed by Him.

## Historical Context

---

Nebuchadnezzar's campaigns brought destruction throughout the region. Egypt and her allies (including Ethiopia/Cush) experienced military defeat and economic devastation, fulfilling these prophecies within decades.
