

Ezekiel 30:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Ethiopia, and Libya, and Lydia, and all the mingled people, and Chub, and the men of the land that is in league, shall fall with them by the sword.

Analysis

This comprehensive list (Ethiopia, Libya, Lydia, 'mingled people,' and 'men of the land that is in league') shows Egypt's widespread alliances, all of whom would share her fate. Dependence on human alliances provides false security. The phrase 'fall by the sword' indicates violent military defeat across Egypt's entire alliance network.

Historical Context

These nations represented Egypt's mercenary forces and political allies. Ethiopia (Cush) was Egypt's southern neighbor, Libya (Put) to the west, Lydia (possibly Ludim/Libyans) across the Mediterranean. The 'mingled people' were foreign mercenaries in Egyptian service.
