

# Ezekiel 9:10

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And as for me also, mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity, but I will recompense their way upon their head.

## Analysis

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**"As for me also, mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity, but I will recompense their way upon their head."** God responds to Ezekiel's intercession by affirming judgment's necessity. The repetition of "mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity" (cf. 5:11; 7:4, 9; 8:18) emphasizes settled determination. "Recompense their way upon their head" (darkam be-rosham natati, דָּרְכָם בְּרוּשָׁם נָתָתִי) means giving them exactly what their conduct deserves—perfect measure-for-measure justice. God's refusal to spare demonstrates that persistent sin exhausts divine patience, requiring full judgment.

## Historical Context

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God's unwavering commitment to execute judgment without mitigation seems harsh but reflects perfect justice. For decades (even centuries), Israel received warnings, reformations, prophetic pleas, and opportunities for repentance. Each was spurned. When patience is systematically violated and mercy presumed upon, unmixed judgment becomes necessary to vindicate divine holiness and teach future generations the seriousness of covenant violation.
