

Hebrews 2:11

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren,

Analysis

'He that sanctifieth' (Christ) and 'they who are sanctified' (believers) share one origin ('all of one'). This could refer to common humanity, common Father, or both. The point is Christ's solidarity with His people, making Him unashamed to call them brothers. This familial language emphasizes covenant intimacy and Christ's identification with sinful humanity.

Historical Context

The family metaphor would resonate in the honor-shame culture of the ancient world. For Christ to claim kinship with sinners demonstrates radical grace and breaks down barriers between holy God and unholy humanity.

Additional Cross-References

Hebrews 10:10 (Holy): By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Hebrews 13:12 (Parallel theme): Wherefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate.

Hebrews 2:14 (Parallel theme): Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil;
