

Isaiah 41:9

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Thou whom I have taken from the ends of the earth, and called thee from the chief men thereof, and said unto thee, Thou art my servant; I have chosen thee, and not cast thee away.

Analysis

God's choice extends to the ends of the earth ('chief men' is better 'corners/ extremities'), calling Israel from remote places. The threefold declaration—'I have chosen thee,' 'not cast thee away,' and naming as 'my servant'—provides powerful assurance. The Hebrew 'ma'as' (cast away/rejected) is negated, promising permanent election.

Historical Context

Though geographically scattered and politically subjugated, Israel remains God's chosen people. Distance and displacement cannot nullify God's electing love, providing hope to exiles feeling abandoned.

1. How does God's promise never to cast you away address your fears of abandonment?
2. In what ways does God's calling reach you even in your 'far off' or remote spiritual condition?

Additional Cross-References

Luke 13:29 (Parallel theme): And they shall come from the east, and from the west, and from the north, and from the south, and shall sit down in the kingdom of God.
