

Isaiah 42:10

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Sing unto the LORD a new song, and his praise from the end of the earth, ye that go down to the sea, and all that is therein; the isles, and the inhabitants thereof.

Analysis

The call to sing a new song ('shir chadash') to the LORD celebrates coming redemption. The Hebrew 'shiy'r' denotes exuberant praise. This worship encompasses the entire earth—from sea to islands, from ends of the earth—universal scope. New mercies demand new praise.

Historical Context

This anticipates the global spread of God's kingdom beyond Israel. Revelation 5:9 echoes this with the 'new song' sung by redeemed from every tribe and nation through Christ's blood.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 33:3 (Sin): Sing unto him a new song; play skilfully with a loud noise.
