

Isaiah 44:25

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

That frustrateth the tokens of the liars, and maketh diviners mad; that turneth wise men backward, and maketh their knowledge foolish;

Analysis

God 'frustrates the tokens of the liars' (Babylonian omens and signs), 'makes diviners mad' (exposes their fraudulence), 'turns wise men backward' (reverses their wisdom), and 'makes their knowledge foolish.' The Hebrew 'sakal' (make foolish) shows divine exposure of human pretension. Against human wisdom, God's word stands.

Historical Context

Babylon was famous for its wise men, astrologers, and diviners (Daniel 2:2). God's frustration of their predictions vindicated His prophets and demonstrated that true wisdom comes only from Him.

Related Passages

John 3:16 — God's love and salvation

Ephesians 2:8 — Salvation by grace through faith

1. How does God expose the foolishness of wisdom that excludes Him?

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 33:10 (Parallel theme): The LORD bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought: he maketh the devices of the people of none effect.
