

# Isaiah 45:22

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else.

## Analysis

---

The gospel invitation: 'Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else.' The Hebrew 'panah' (look/turn) indicates a turning of attention, allegiance, and trust. Salvation comes by looking to God - not by works, rituals, or merit. The scope is universal: 'all the ends of the earth.'

## Historical Context

---

This remarkable verse extends salvation beyond Israel to all nations. It anticipates the Great Commission and the gospel's worldwide proclamation. Spurgeon called this the verse that led to his conversion.

## Additional Cross-References

**John 6:40** (Parallel theme): And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.

time? have not I the LORD? and there is no God else beside me; a just God and a Saviour; there is none beside me.

**Titus 2:13** (Salvation): Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;

**Isaiah 49:6** (Salvation): And he said, It is a light thing that thou shouldest be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved of Israel: I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation unto the end of the earth.
