

Isaiah 49:4

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Then I said, I have laboured in vain, I have spent my strength for nought, and in vain: yet surely my judgment is with the LORD, and my work with my God.

Analysis

The Servant's lament 'I have laboured in vain, I have spent my strength for nought' expresses the apparent futility of faithful ministry when people reject the message. Yet the confidence 'my judgment is with the LORD, and my work with my God' demonstrates perseverance grounded in divine approval, not human response. This models ministry faithfulness when results seem absent - God evaluates effort and faithfulness, not visible success.

Historical Context

Isaiah preached for decades with little positive response (6:9-13), anticipating Jesus' rejection by the majority. The principle that 'judgment is with the LORD' sustained prophets, Christ, apostles, and missionaries through apparent failure.

Additional Cross-References

Isaiah 35:4 (References God): Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he will come and save you.

Galatians 4:11 (Parallel theme): I am afraid of you, lest I have bestowed upon you labour in vain.

Isaiah 62:11 (References Lord): Behold, the LORD hath proclaimed unto the end of the world, Say ye to the daughter of Zion, Behold, thy salvation cometh; behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him.

Isaiah 40:10 (References God): Behold, the Lord GOD will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him.
