

Isaiah 50:4

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

The Lord GOD hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned.

Analysis

The Servant's claim 'The Lord GOD hath given me the tongue of the learned' describes His teaching ministry with divine authority. The purpose 'that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary' shows pastoral care for the exhausted. The daily empowerment 'he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned' depicts continual divine instruction, anticipating Jesus' practice of pre-dawn prayer (Mark 1:35).

Historical Context

Isaiah received this prophetic gifting, but Jesus perfectly embodies this - His words uniquely comforted the burdened (Matthew 11:28) while confounding the proud. The daily 'wakening' shows that even God incarnate maintained dependent communion with Father.

Additional Cross-References

Luke 21:15 (Parallel theme): For I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which all your adversaries shall not be able to gainsay nor resist.
