

# Isaiah 51:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

My righteousness is near; my salvation is gone forth, and mine arms shall judge the people; the isles shall wait upon me, and on mine arm shall they trust.

## Analysis

---

The promise 'My righteousness is near; my salvation is gone forth' emphasizes the imminent arrival of God's deliverance. The phrase 'mine arms shall judge the people' depicts divine strength executing justice and salvation. The prediction that 'the isles shall wait upon me' and 'on mine arm shall they trust' shows Gentiles expecting salvation from Israel's God - a radical vision in ethnic-particularist context.

## Historical Context

---

This began fulfilling when gospel spread to coastal Mediterranean regions (the 'isles'), but awaits complete fulfillment when 'every knee bows' to Christ (Philippians 2:10). God's 'arm' is Christ who executes judgment and saves.

## Additional Cross-References

**Isaiah 46:13** (Salvation): I bring near my righteousness; it shall not be far off, and my salvation shall not tarry: and I will place salvation in Zion for Israel my glory.

**Isaiah 56:1** (Salvation): Thus saith the LORD, Keep ye judgment, and do justice: for my salvation is near to come, and my righteousness to be revealed.

**Isaiah 63:5** (Salvation): And I looked, and there was none to help; and I wondered that there was none to uphold: therefore mine own arm brought salvation unto me; and my fury, it upheld me.

**Isaiah 40:10** (Parallel theme): Behold, the Lord GOD will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him.

**Acts 17:31** (Righteousness): Because he hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he hath ordained; whereof he hath given assurance unto all men, in that he hath raised him from the dead.
