

Isaiah 51:7

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Hearken unto me, ye that know righteousness, the people in whose heart is my law; fear ye not the reproach of men, neither be ye afraid of their revilings.

Analysis

The address to those with 'my law in your heart' describes true believers - internal transformation, not mere external conformity (Jeremiah 31:33). The command 'fear ye not the reproach of men, neither be ye afraid of their revilings' calls for courage grounded in divine approval over human opinion. Those with God's word internalized can withstand social pressure because identity rests in God, not peer acceptance.

Historical Context

Exiles faced mockery from Babylonians and later opposition rebuilding Jerusalem (Nehemiah 4:1-3). The internalized law sustained faithful remnant through ridicule. Same principle applies to Christians facing secular culture's contempt.

1. How does having God's law 'in your heart' (internalized Word) provide courage to withstand cultural opposition?

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 37:31 (Word): The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide.

Matthew 5:11 (Evil): Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.

Jeremiah 1:17 (Parallel theme): Thou therefore gird up thy loins, and arise, and speak unto them all that I command thee: be not dismayed at their faces, lest I confound thee before them.

2 Corinthians 3:3 (Parallel theme): Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart.

1 Peter 4:4 (Evil): Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you:
