

# Isaiah 59:20

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

And the Redeemer shall come to Zion, and unto them that turn from transgression in Jacob, saith the LORD.

## Analysis

---

'And the Redeemer shall come to Zion, and unto them that turn from transgression in Jacob, saith the LORD.' The Hebrew 'Go'el' (Redeemer/Kinsman-Redeemer) comes with conditions: He comes to those who 'turn from transgression.' Repentance is the prerequisite for experiencing redemption. Paul quotes this in Romans 11:26.

## Historical Context

---

This promise of the Redeemer's coming to Zion finds fulfillment in Christ's first coming and ultimate fulfillment in His return. Paul applies it to future Israel's salvation.

## Additional Cross-References

**Hebrews 12:14** (References Lord): Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:

**Acts 3:19** (Sin): Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord;

**Joel 2:32** (References Lord): And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the LORD shall be delivered: for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the LORD hath said, and in the remnant whom the LORD shall call.

**Isaiah 40:9** (Parallel theme): O Zion, that bringest good tidings, get thee up into the high mountain; O Jerusalem, that bringest good tidings, lift up thy voice with strength; lift it up, be not afraid; say unto the cities of Judah, Behold your God!

**Acts 26:20** (Parallel theme): But shewed first unto them of Damascus, and at Jerusalem, and throughout all the coasts of Judaea, and then to the Gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God, and do works meet for repentance.

**Daniel 9:13** (References Lord): As it is written in the law of Moses, all this evil is come upon us: yet made we not our prayer before the LORD our God, that we might turn from our iniquities, and understand thy truth.
