# **Taming the Tongue**

- <sup>1</sup> My brethren, be not many masters, knowing that we shall receive the greater condemnation.
- <sup>2</sup> For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man, and able also to bridle the whole body.
- <sup>3</sup> Behold, we put bits in the horses' mouths, that they may obey us; and we turn about their whole body.
- <sup>4</sup> Behold also the ships, which though they be so great, and are driven of fierce winds, yet are they turned about with a very small helm, whithersoever the governor listeth.
- <sup>5</sup> Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindleth!
- <sup>6</sup> And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.
- <sup>7</sup> For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind:
- $^{8}$  But the tongue can no man tame; it is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison.
- <sup>9</sup> Therewith bless we God, even the Father; and therewith curse we men, which are made after the similitude of God.
- <sup>10</sup> Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be.

- 11 Doth a fountain send forth at the same place sweet water and bitter?
- <sup>12</sup> Can the fig tree, my brethren, bear olive berries? either a vine, figs? so can no fountain both yield salt water and fresh.

#### **Wisdom from Above**

- <sup>13</sup> Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.
- <sup>14</sup> But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth.
- <sup>15</sup> This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish.
- <sup>16</sup> For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
- <sup>17</sup> But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.
- <sup>18</sup> And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

#### **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

**God** — Θεός (Theos)

God

The Greek **Theos** ( $\Theta \epsilon \acute{o} \varsigma$ ) refers to deity, used both for the one true God and false gods. Context determines whether it denotes the Father specifically or the Godhead generally.

Mercy — ἕλεος (Eleos)

Mercy, compassion

The Greek **eleos** (ἕλεος) denotes compassionate mercy—pity for those in distress. God is 'rich in mercy' (Ephesians 2:4), withholding deserved punishment and granting undeserved kindness.

# Righteous — δίκαιος (Dikaios)

Righteous, just

The Greek **dikaios** (δίκαιος) means righteous or just—conforming to God's standard. Christ's righteousness is imputed to believers through faith (Romans 4:5), making them legally righteous before God.

### **Truth** — ἀλήθεια (Aletheia)

Truth, reality

The Greek **aletheia** (ἀλήθεια) denotes truth or reality—that which corresponds to actuality. Jesus declared, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life' (John 14:6), embodying ultimate reality.

#### Word — λόγος (Logos)

Word, reason, message

The Greek **Logos** (Λόγος) means word, reason, or message—the rational principle underlying reality. John identifies Christ as the eternal Logos: 'In the beginning was the Word' (John 1:1).
