Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms.

Analysis

Is any among you afflicted? let him pray. Is any merry? let him sing psalms.
Is anyone suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms. James directs every emotion toward God—lament becomes prayer, joy becomes praise.

Reformed spirituality integrates all of life with God; prayer and worship are appropriate responses to both sorrow and celebration.

Historical Context

Diaspora believers experienced rapid swings between persecution and small victories. James equips them to process emotions in community through prayer and song, echoing the Psalms.

Additional Cross-References

Psalms 50:15 (Parallel theme): And call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me.

Ephesians 5:19 (Sin): Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord;

Jonah 2:2 (Parallel theme): And said, I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the LORD, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

Hebrews 5:7 (Prayer): Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared;

Luke 22:44 (Prayer): And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly: and his sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground.
