

# Jeremiah 11:20

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

But, O LORD of hosts, that judgest righteously, that triest the reins and the heart, let me see thy vengeance on them: for unto thee have I revealed my cause.

## Analysis

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This verse appeals for divine justice: 'But, O LORD of hosts, that judgest righteously, that triest the reins and the heart.' Jeremiah appeals to God as righteous Judge (shophet tsedek) who tests (bochen) inner motivations. 'Reins' (kelayoth, kidneys) and 'heart' (lev) represent the seat of emotions and will—God examines motives, not just actions. 'Let me see thy vengeance on them: for unto thee have I revealed my cause.' The Hebrew neqamah (נִקְמָה, vengeance) is divine vindication, not personal revenge. 'Revealed my cause' (galithi eth-rivi) means entrusted his case to God's court. Jeremiah doesn't seek personal retaliation but commits his situation to divine justice.

## Historical Context

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This appeal for divine vengeance appears throughout Jeremiah's confessions (15:15, 17:18, 18:21-23, 20:12). The 'reins and heart' phrase appears also in Jeremiah 17:10, 20:12, and Psalm 7:9—emphasizing God's complete knowledge of human motivation. Similar appeals appear in imprecatory Psalms (Psalm 35, 69, 109). These are not personal vendettas but appeals to divine justice against those who oppose God's word.

## Additional Cross-References

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**Jeremiah 20:12** (Righteousness): But, O LORD of hosts, that triest the righteous, and seest the reins and the heart, let me see thy vengeance on them: for unto thee have I opened my cause.

**Jeremiah 17:10** (References Lord): I the LORD search the heart, I try the reins, even to give every man according to his ways, and according to the fruit of his doings.

**1 Chronicles 29:17** (Parallel theme): I know also, my God, that thou triest the heart, and hast pleasure in uprightness. As for me, in the uprightness of mine heart I have willingly offered all these things: and now have I seen with joy thy people, which are present here, to offer willingly unto thee.

**Genesis 18:25** (Righteousness): That be far from thee to do after this manner, to slay the righteous with the wicked: and that the righteous should be as the wicked, that be far from thee: Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?
