

# Jeremiah 30:17

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

For I will restore health unto thee, and I will heal thee of thy wounds, saith the LORD; because they called thee an Outcast, saying, This is Zion, whom no man seeketh after.

## Analysis

God promises to heal those considered incurable and to restore those society has rejected ('an Outcast'). The term 'Zion' represents God's chosen people; their abandonment by others doesn't change God's commitment. This reflects the gospel's reversal of values - those rejected by the world are precious to God (1 Pet 2:10). God specializes in healing what others consider hopeless.

## Historical Context

Jerusalem ('Zion') had become an outcast among nations, defeated and despised. Yet God promises restoration beyond what seemed possible.

## Additional Cross-References

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**Psalms 107:20** (Parallel theme): He sent his word, and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions.

**Jeremiah 33:6** (Parallel theme): Behold, I will bring it health and cure, and I will cure them, and will reveal unto them the abundance of peace and truth.

**1 Peter 2:24** (Parallel theme): Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.

**Isaiah 30:26** (References Lord): Moreover the light of the moon shall be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun shall be sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day that the LORD bindeth up the breach of his people, and healeth the stroke of their wound.

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
