

Jeremiah 30:3

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

For, lo, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will bring again the captivity of my people Israel and Judah, saith the LORD: and I will cause them to return to the land that I gave to their fathers, and they shall possess it.

Analysis

The phrase 'I will bring again the captivity' uses the Hebrew 'shub shebut' - a wordplay on returning/restoring. This promise transcends the Babylonian exile, pointing to ultimate restoration when Israel recognizes her Messiah (Rom 11:25-26). God's covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob remains unbreakable despite Israel's unfaithfulness. The land promise finds ultimate fulfillment in the new heavens and new earth.

Historical Context

This begins the 'Book of Consolation' (chapters 30-33), delivered while Jeremiah was imprisoned. Even in judgment's darkest hour, God promises ultimate restoration.

Jeremiah 16:15 (References Lord): But, The LORD liveth, that brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north, and from all the lands whither he had driven them: and I will bring them again into their land that I gave unto their fathers.

Jeremiah 32:44 (References Lord): Men shall buy fields for money, and subscribe evidences, and seal them, and take witnesses in the land of Benjamin, and in the places about Jerusalem, and in the cities of Judah, and in the cities of the mountains, and in the cities of the valley, and in the cities of the south: for I will cause their captivity to return, saith the LORD.

Jeremiah 33:26 (Parallel theme): Then will I cast away the seed of Jacob, and David my servant, so that I will not take any of his seed to be rulers over the seed of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob: for I will cause their captivity to return, and have mercy on them.

Hebrews 8:8 (References Lord): For finding fault with them, he saith, Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah:

Psalms 53:6 (References Israel): Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! When God bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.

Joel 3:1 (Parallel theme): For, behold, in those days, and in that time, when I shall bring again the captivity of Judah and Jerusalem,

Ezekiel 36:24 (Parallel theme): For I will take you from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land.
